ITEM 1. Roger & Son

Roger Clark (sax) and Rory Clark (piano) were joined by Allan Smith (drums) and Doug Kuhn (bass) as they performed:

- ✔ Just Friends, a popular song that has become a jazz standard. The music was written in 1931 by John Klenner. They followed this with
- ☐ Cheek to Cheek, written by Irving Berlin in 1935 for the film "Top Hat". It was named the #1 Song of 1935.







ITEM 2. Sylvester Kroyherr

Accompanying himself on guitar, Sylvester played and sang:

- Speak to Me of Love, originally a French song written in 1930, it has since become popular in English and recorded by many artists, including Barbra Streisand.

ITEM 3. Vincent O'Connor

Accompanied by Grahame Taylor on the piano, Vincent became The Phantom to sing:

- The Music of the Night, written by Andrew Lloyd Webber for the 1986 musical "The Phantom of the Opera". Then, shedding his disguise, Vincent followed up with
- On the Street Where You Live, the lovely ballad from the 1956 Broadway musical, "My Fair Lady", lyrics by Alan Jay Lerner and music by Frederick Loewe.





ITEM 4. Rachel & her Gentlemen of Jazz

Rachel Camerino was accompanied by David Taylor (bass), Grahame Taylor (piano), Paul Phillips (drums) and John Calamatta (sax) while she sang:

- It's Only a Paper Moon. Written for an unsuccessful 1932 Broadway play set in Coney Island, it's lasting fame stems from recordings by popular artists during the last years of World War II with versions by Ella Fitzgerald Benny Goodman's band, etc. Rachel then sang

ITEM 5. President's guests: Pianists Tamara Vasilevitsky and Polina Ratner-Paulchinskaia

- ♣ Firstly, Tamara regaled us with an incredible Medley of classical and standard numbers, flawlessly switching from one to the other every few seconds, then;
- Joined at the piano by her mother, Polina, they played a duet, a **Tango Medley**, again switching hands and musical numbers with incredible facility and rapidity.

Michael used Bach's Orchestra Suite No 3 Air in G to introduce his own composition, a Medley of Michael's Fantasy World.

ITEM 8. Graeme Davies & Friends

Graeme was accompanied by Ray Quon (piano), David Taylor (bass), Barrie Boyes (sax) and Alan Richards (drums) while he sang

- ▶ Smile, a song composed by Charlie Chaplin based on an instrumental theme used in the soundtrack for his 1936 film "Modern Times"; and
- The More I See You. Composed.by Harry Warren with lyrics by Mack Gordon, it was originally sung by Dick Haymes in the 1945 film, "Diamond Horseshoe". Graeme also played his sax during this number.

ITEM 9. Sheilala

Sheila Whitson was joined by Grahame Taylor (piano), Doug Kuhn (bass), Allan Smith (drums) and Barrie Boyes (sax) as she sang:

Just in Time, a popular song with melody written by Jule Styne and lyrics by Betty Comden and Adolph Green. It was introduced by Judy Holliday and Sydney Chaplin the 1956 Broadway musical "Bells Are Ringing"; and

 Alabama, a 1934 jazz standard composed by Frank Perkins with lyrics by Mitchell Paris.





ITEM 10. Anita Harris & Friends

Accompanied by Kim Harris (piano), Alan Richards (drums) and David Taylor (bass), Anita sang:

- At Long Last Love, a popular song by Cole Porter, written for his 1938 musical "You Never Know": and
- ☐ Polka Dots & Moonbeams. Published in 1940, this was Frank Sinatra's first hit recorded with the Tommy Dorsey Orchestra.

ITEM 11. Blue Tango

Lynne Gough and Dave Richard were joined by Allan Smith (drums) for the first number:

- ♣ a melding of two numbers, Lynne sang Blue Skies, by Irving Berlin while Dave hummed, James Taylor's Sunny Skies, then:
- We're Called Blue Tango. This tune was a parody written by Dave of the song "Halleluyah" by Leonard Cohen, due to how weary they were of regularly being asked to sing it. Clever alternative lyrics inserted.



ITEM 12. Annie Smith & Friends

Annie was supported by John Curtis (piano), David Taylor (bass), Barrie Boyes (sax) and Allan Smith (drums) while she sang:

- ♣ Honeysuckle Rose, a Fats Waller number from 1929; and
- ☑ Between the Devil and the Deep Blue
 Sea. First recorded by Cab Calloway in 1931, it was introduced in the Cotton Club show "Rhythmania" and is now a widely recorded standard.

ITEM 13. John Calamatta & Friends

John Calamatta and his friends Stuart Petchey (vocals), David Taylor (bass) and John Curtin (piano) performed:

- ♪ I've Got the World on a String, a 1932
 popular jazz song, composed by Harold Arlen
 and Ted Koehler. It was written for the twentyfirst edition of the Cotton Club series which
 opened on 23rd October 1932; and:
- J I've Never Been in Love Before, written by Frank Loesser and published in 1950 it was sung as a duet between Sky Masterson and Sister Sarah Brown in the Broadway production of "Guys & Dolls", but omitted from the film, except as background music.
